

Is the router included with the fiber optic cable

Standard home routers do not include fiber optic cables and cannot directly connect to a fiber line; an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) is required to convert the fiber signal for the router.

How Fiber Internet Connects to a Router

Fiber optic internet transmits data as light pulses through ultra-thin glass or plastic strands, which cannot be directly received by a standard router . The fiber line from your internet service provider terminates at an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), a device installed inside or near your home. The ONT converts the light-based fiber signal into standard electrical signals that a router can use .

Router Connection

Once the ONT converts the signal, a standard Ethernet cable runs from the ONT's LAN or Ethernet port to the router's WAN or Internet port . This allows the router to distribute internet access to your devices via Wi-Fi or additional Ethernet connections. Some advanced routers may have an SFP port for direct fiber input, but most home setups rely on the ONT as an intermediary .
