Outdoor Wiring

They require weatherproof enclosures with higher NEMA or IP ratings (e.g., NEMA 3R or 4) to prevent water ingress . Outdoor wiring often uses THHN/THWN conductors in conduit or UF cable rated for wet locations . The box must be mounted securely, often on a backer board, and penetrations should be properly flashed and sealed to prevent water intrusion . Outdoor panels may handle heavier loads and require more durable components than indoor panels .

Transitioning Wiring from Indoor to Outdoor

When wiring transitions from an indoor panel to an outdoor disconnect or distribution box, it is common to:

- o Run the cable through a wall cavity or attic to the exterior.
- o Transition into conduit (rigid, flexible, or liquid-tight) at the point of exit to protect against moisture and mechanical damage .
- o Use proper fittings and caulking to seal the penetration while ensuring water drains away from the box .
- o Ensure all wiring and enclosures comply with NEC requirements for wet or damp locations .

- o Enclosure Rating: Indoor boxes need basic protection; outdoor boxes require weatherproof ratings.
