

Ivory Coast Tariff Costs Butterfly-shaped Optical Cable Introduction G 652

Article Overview

Importing butterfly-shaped optical cables (ITU-T G.652) into Cote d'Ivoire is subject to a 5-10% CET duty, 18% VAT, and additional levies based on CIF value.

Customs Duty and Tariff Structure

Cote d'Ivoire applies the Common External Tariff (CET) of ECOWAS and WAEMU. Import duties are calculated on an ad valorem basis using the CIF value (cost, insurance, and freight) of the goods, following the Brussels Definition of Value (BDV) for customs valuation . The CET has five main bands:

- o 0%: Essential social goods (e.g., medicines)
- o 5%: Raw materials and capital goods, which typically includes telecommunication equipment and optical cables
- o 10%: Intermediate goods
- o 20%: Final consumption goods
- o 35%: Sensitive or luxury items Butterfly-shaped optical cables, being capital goods for network infrastructure, are generally classified under the 5% tariff band, though exact classification depends on the HS code assigned in the GUCE portal .

Additional Taxes and Levies

Beyond customs duties, importers must pay:

- o Statistical duty: 1% of CIF value
- o Value-Added Tax (VAT): 18% on CIF value plus all duties and levies
- o Community and solidarity levies: May apply depending on product category
- o Customs brokerage fees: Charged by local agents for filing import declarations For example, if the CIF value of a shipment of G.652 optical cables is \$50,000, the estimated import costs would be:
 - o Customs duty (5%): \$2,500
 - o Statistical duty (1%): \$500
 - o VAT (18% on CIF + duties): \$9,450 Total estimated import cost: \$12,450, excluding brokerage or terminal surcharges .

Technical Considerations

The G.652 standard specifies single-mode optical fiber suitable for 1310 nm and 1550 nm transmission, with

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defined attenuation, chromatic dispersion, and mechanical properties . Butterfly-shaped cables are designed for easy deployment in ducts or aerial installations, and their classification under the telecommunication equipment HS codes ensures they are treated as capital goods for tariff purposes.

Practical Tips

- o Use the GUCE portal to confirm the exact HS code and applicable CET rate for your specific cable model .
 - o Include insurance and freight costs in the CIF value to accurately calculate duties.
 - o Check for local surcharges at Abidjan port, which may include terminal handling fees or TEU-based charges .
 - o Consider consulting a customs broker to ensure compliance with all levies and documentation requirements.
- By following these steps, importers can accurately estimate the total landed cost of butterfly-shaped G.652 optical cables in Cote d'Ivoire.
