Jumper wires come in male, female, or male-to-female configurations, allowing them to connect to headers, sockets, or other components . They are flexible, reusable, and convenient for temporary or permanent connections.

Using Jumper Wires as Pigtails

In practice, a jumper wire can function as a pigtail by connecting the main circuit wires to a device terminal. For example:

- o Strip the ends to expose the conductor. One end is connected to the device terminal (forming a loop around the screw), and the other end is twisted together with the main circuit wires and secured with a wire nut .
