Unlike standard copper low-voltage cables (Cat5e, Cat6, Cat6a), fiber optic cables are immune to electromagnetic interference and can support much higher bandwidths, which is essential for modern data centers, office networks, and multi-building connections ().

- o Singlemode Fiber: Designed for long-distance transmission, typically used in campus networks or inter-building connections. It has a small core diameter and uses laser light for data transmission ().
- o Multimode Fiber: Suitable for shorter distances, such as within a building or data center. It has a larger core and uses LED light sources, supporting high-speed connections over moderate distances ().
- o Indoor vs. Outdoor: Indoor cables are designed for use within walls or conduits, often with fire-resistant jackets. Outdoor cables are UV-resistant, weatherproof, and sometimes direct-burial rated for underground installation ().
