

Maintenance Procedures for Small Cable Trays

Routine Inspection and Visual Checks

Cleaning and Coating Maintenance

Keep trays clean using a soft brush or cloth to remove dust, dirt, and oil. In humid, dusty, or corrosive environments, increase cleaning frequency. Inspect the protective coating for peeling, cracks, or corrosion. Damaged coatings should be repaired or recoated promptly to prevent further deterioration and extend tray life .

Fastening and Connector Checks

Regularly inspect connectors, joints, and bolts to ensure they are firm and reliable. Loose or damaged connectors should be tightened or replaced. For metal trays, ensure rust prevention treatments such as rust-proof paint or inhibitors are applied where necessary .

Grounding and Electrical Safety

Verify that the grounding system is functioning properly to reduce static electricity accumulation and prevent electrical faults. Grounding should be checked before energizing cables and periodically thereafter .

Handling Inactive or Damaged Cables

Remove inactive or dead cables to free up space and improve ventilation. Only competent personnel should perform this task. If trays or supports are damaged (e.g., bent rungs, broken welds, or deformed rails), corrective maintenance should be carried out immediately .

Record-Keeping and Supervision

Maintain detailed records of inspections, cleaning, repairs, and any issues identified, including dates and corrective actions. Train maintenance personnel to ensure proper knowledge and skills, and supervise work to maintain quality .

Environmental Considerations

In harsh environments, such as outdoor or industrial settings, check for corrosion, heat buildup, and material compatibility. Ensure bolts, hangers, and trays are made of compatible materials to prevent galvanic corrosion. Overfilled trays should be supplemented with additional trays to avoid overheating and insulation breakdown .

Maintenance Schedule

- o Visual inspections: Monthly or as recommended by the manufacturer.
- o Cleaning and coating checks: Quarterly or more frequently in harsh conditions.
- o Fastening and grounding checks: During routine inspections or after abnormal events.
- o Corrective maintenance: As soon as damage or faults are detected .
