Securing Cables

Cable Separation and Organization

- o Maintain a proper fill ratio, typically 40-50% of tray capacity for power cables, to allow airflow and prevent overheating .

Strain Relief

Cables should be secured near devices or terminations to relieve stress on connectors. This prevents pulling forces from damaging terminations and ensures long-term reliability .

Grounding and Bonding

For metallic trays, bonding jumpers or grounding clamps should connect all tray sections to ensure electrical continuity and safety . If the tray is used as an Equipment Grounding Conductor (EGC), ensure proper cross-sectional area and use insulated conductors where necessary to prevent corrosion, especially in aluminum trays . Regular inspection of grounding connections is recommended.

Compliance and Best Practices

- o Use approved tray-rated cables only .
- o Follow NEC Article 392 for tray fill, support spacing, and grounding requirements .
- o Plan tray layout carefully, considering bends, junctions, and future maintenance .
- o Use large-radius bends to prevent cable damage and maintain bend radius per manufacturer specifications .
