

Mount the cable tray to the server rack

Place the tray onto the supports and secure it with bolts or clamps. Ensure the tray is aligned with the rack and other trays for a clean, organized path. Avoid blocking airflow or access to equipment .

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Lay cables into the tray, keeping power and data cables separated to reduce interference. Use Velcro straps or cable ties to bundle cables neatly, leaving some slack to prevent stress. Avoid over-tightening ties to prevent cable damage . Maintain clear access for future maintenance or upgrades.

Step 7: Verify and Adjust

Check that the tray and cables do not obstruct airflow, cooling, or maintenance access. Confirm that the tray can handle the cable load and that all fasteners are secure. Make adjustments as needed to ensure a safe, organized, and scalable installation .
