Its primary function is to splice, secure, and protect optical fibers connecting the incoming drop cable to pigtails or patch cables, ensuring reliable signal transmission . **Key Features:**

- o Offers mechanical support to prevent fiber bending or tensile stress.
- o Typically supports 1 to 12 fibers, depending on the model.
- o Compact design suitable for indoor or near-user deployment.
- o Can be wall-mounted or pole-mounted, with environmental protection for outdoor versions . **Applications:**
- o End-user access points in FTTH or FTTB networks.
- o Connection to ONU/ONT devices or optical socket panels.
- o Small-scale indoor distribution nodes in buildings .

Optical Fiber Distribution Box

Definition and Function: The optical fiber distribution box (FDB) is an intermediate node used to distribute fibers from feeder or backbone cables to multiple subscriber access points. It is typically installed in building corridors, stairways, outside walls, or shared community spaces . **Key Features:**

- o Contains fiber splice trays, PLC optical splitters, and adapters.
- o Supports higher fiber capacities than terminal boxes, often ranging from 12 to 24 cores or more.
- o Provides protection for fiber splices and pigtails.
- o Can be installed indoors or outdoors with dustproof and waterproof designs.
- o Allows flexible mounting on walls, poles, or inside cabinets . **Applications:**
- o Distribution points in residential or commercial buildings.
- o Intermediate nodes in FTTH/FTTB networks connecting feeder cables to multiple drop cables.
- o Supports network expansion and maintenance by centralizing fiber management .
