- o Ampacity Derating: Cables in trays have reduced ampacity compared to free-air installations due to restricted airflow and mutual heating effects. Derating factors must be applied to ensure safe current-carrying capacity .
- o Separation: Power cables should be separated from signal or data cables to minimize electromagnetic interference .
- o Bend Radius and Support: Maintain minimum bend radius and proper spacing to prevent mechanical stress and ensure easy maintenance .
- o Accessibility: Arrange cables neatly to allow inspection, maintenance, and future expansion .

- o Avoid stacking cables excessively; leave space for airflow.
- o Use ladder trays for high-current power cables to maximize cooling.

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- o Consider solid or ventilated trays in areas requiring protection from debris or liquids.
- o Ensure insulation integrity and avoid sharp bends or forced pulls during installation. By following these guidelines, power cords can be safely and efficiently routed through cable trays, meeting both operational and code compliance requirements .
