

Price of anti-sway bracket spacing for cable trays

Factors Affecting Price

- o **Installation Environment:** Outdoor, high-vibration, or high-moisture environments may require specialized coatings or reinforced brackets, which can increase price .

Recommended Spacing

Traditional guidelines suggest installing brackets every 1 to 1.5 meters along the cable tray to prevent sagging and sway . However, spacing can be adjusted based on:

- o Weight of cables and tray
- o Material strength of the tray
- o Environmental factors such as wind, vibration, or temperature fluctuations
- o Compliance with local electrical codes and safety standards Increasing spacing reduces the number of brackets required, lowering material and labor costs, but must be balanced against structural integrity .

Practical Cost Estimation

For a typical installation:

- o Light-duty galvanized steel bracket: \$10-\$20 each
- o Stainless steel or heavy-duty adjustable bracket: \$25-\$50 each
- o Total cost depends on the number of brackets, which is determined by tray length and spacing (e.g., a 30-meter tray with 1.5-meter spacing requires ~20 brackets) For precise pricing, it is recommended to contact
