o Size and Installation: Distribution boxes are smaller, wall-mounted, and used for terminal distribution; power boxes or cabinets are larger, floor-mounted, and handle higher voltages and capacities .

o Functionality: Distribution boxes focus on final circuit distribution and protection, whereas power boxes manage main or intermediate power distribution and may include monitoring and control functions .
