

Removal of electrical distribution box inside wall

Article Overview

To safely remove an electrical distribution box, first disconnect power, then detach the box, and finally patch the wall while ensuring code compliance.

Safety First

Before starting, turn off the power at the circuit breaker and verify with a voltage tester that the box is not live . Ensure there are no water pipes or other hazards near the box to prevent accidents . If you are uncomfortable with electrical work, consult a licensed electrician.

Tools You May Need

- o Voltage tester
- o Screwdrivers (flathead and Phillips)
- o Pliers
- o Wire nuts
- o Multitool or reciprocating saw (for cutting nails or fasteners)
- o Protective gloves and eye protection
- o Drywall repair tools (joint compound, tape, sandpaper)

Step-by-Step Removal

- o Remove the Cover Plate: Unscrew the faceplate to expose the box .
- o Disconnect Wiring: Carefully loosen screws securing wires and remove them from the box. Inspect wires for damage and replace if necessary .
- o Detach the Box:
 - o For metal or nailed-in boxes, gently pry the box away from the wall using a flathead screwdriver or multitool. Cut nails or screws if needed .
 - o For old work boxes, remove any mounting brackets or clips holding the box in place .
- o Remove the Box: Once detached, carefully pull the box out, ensuring no wires are pinched or damaged .

Wall Restoration

- o Patch the Drywall: Cut a clean section around the removed box, install a drywall patch, tape, and apply joint compound. Sand smooth once dry.
- o Optional: If the wiring is permanently removed, ensure all connections are safely capped with wire nuts inside a junction box or follow local code for concealed wiring . Never leave live wires behind drywall

Code Considerations

- o Electrical connections must remain accessible unless permanently decommissioned and disconnected .
- o Simply covering live connections with drywall is not code-compliant. If the circuit is still active, a new box or junction must be installed.
- o Always follow local electrical codes and regulations when removing or relocating boxes. By following these steps, you can safely remove an electrical distribution box, protect yourself from electrical hazards, and restore the wall to a finished state while remaining compliant with safety standards .
