Key Considerations Before Replacement

- o **Wire Preparation and Connection:** Strip insulation, connect line, neutral, and ground wires to the correct terminals, and install circuit breakers or RCDs according to your load requirements.
- o **Label and Organize Circuits:** Clearly mark each circuit for future maintenance and troubleshooting. Route wires neatly and leave space for heat dissipation.
- o **Testing:** Perform insulation resistance tests and verify all connections meet safety standards.
