- o **Wire Gauge and Breaker Rating:** Select wire sizes and breaker ratings according to the load requirements of each circuit .
- o **Neat Cable Management:** Maintain organized wiring to prevent short circuits and facilitate maintenance .

Installation Requirements

- o **Placement:** Install the distribution box in a dry, accessible area with good ventilation, typically around 1.5 meters above the floor .
- o **Enclosure Protection:** Choose boxes with appropriate IP/NEMA ratings for dust and water protection; materials can be steel or plastic depending on indoor or outdoor use .
