

Article Overview

Regulatory Framework

In Samoa, the Electric Power Corporation (EPC) oversees electricity generation, transmission, and distribution, and sets technical standards for electrical installations. - o Compliance with EPC's grid connection requirements is necessary, including integration with SCADA monitoring systems for key distribution points.

o Maintenance and Inspection

- o Regular inspection and maintenance are required to ensure integrity, prevent moisture ingress, and verify protective devices function correctly.
- o Any modifications or upgrades must be approved by EPC to maintain grid reliability.
