

Setting up two routers for fiber optic cable

You can connect two routers to a single fiber optic modem by using the first router as the primary gateway and the second router as an access point or secondary network extension.

Understanding the Setup

Fiber optic internet requires an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts the fiber signal into Ethernet for your router. Typically, the ISP provides a single ONT or a modem-router combo. - o Adjust Wi-Fi channels and SSIDs to minimize interference.
- o Place the secondary router strategically to cover dead zones or provide additional wired connections.
