

Article Overview

Cable tray supports should generally be spaced 3 to 5 meters for horizontal runs and 1.5 meters for vertical runs, with additional considerations for cable type, load, and safety standards.

Horizontal and Vertical Support Spacing

For horizontal cable tray runs, supports should be installed at the start, end, and at every 3 to 5 meters along straight sections to ensure stability and prevent sagging of cables . For vertical runs, cables should be secured at the top and every 1.5 meters to maintain proper alignment and reduce mechanical strain .

Binding and Securing Cables

Cables within trays should be laid straight and orderly, avoiding overlaps or crossings. When using cable ties or bindings, the distance between ties should not exceed 1.5 meters, ensuring even tension and preventing cable damage . For troughs or wireways, binding may not always be necessary, but proper support is still required.

Regulatory and Safety Considerations

All cable supports must comply with relevant standards such as BS EN 61537 for cable trays and BS 6946 for channel support systems . Supports should be made of fire-resistant materials to prevent premature failure in case of fire . The spacing may need adjustment in high-safety areas, such as fire-resistant or explosion-proof zones, based on specific regulatory requirements .

Additional Installation Guidelines

- o Height Above Ground: Cable trays should ideally be installed at least 2.2 meters above the floor .
- o Top Clearance: Maintain a minimum of 0.3 meters from ceilings or obstructions .
- o Tray Fill Rate: Do not exceed 50% cross-sectional fill to allow proper airflow and prevent overheating .
- o Concealed Installations: For suspended ceilings, maintain 80 mm vertical clearance and a maximum 50% fill rate .

Summary

In practice, horizontal supports every 3-5 meters and vertical supports every 1.5 meters provide a reliable standard for cable tray installations. Adjustments may be required based on cable weight, type, environmental conditions, and regulatory requirements to ensure safety, structural integrity, and optimal system performance
