- o **Inspect Wiring and Appliances:** Look for damaged cords, loose connections, or signs of burning. Avoid using appliances that may be faulty .
- o **Check for GFCI Issues:** If a GFCI outlet is on the circuit, it may trip due to moisture or a ground fault. Test and reset the GFCI as needed .
