This prevents electrical hazards and ensures the safety of the building and its occupants.

Modern distribution boxes may include miniature circuit breakers (MCBs), residual current devices (RCDs), or residual current breakers with overcurrent protection (RCBOs). These devices not only protect against overcurrent but also detect leakage currents that could cause electric shocks . Advanced or smart circuit breakers can provide energy monitoring, remote control, and integration with home automation systems, enhancing both safety and energy management .
