Safety and Accessibility Considerations

- o Height: Install the panel so the center of the highest breaker is no more than 6'7" above the floor, with the bottom at least 4 feet from the ground for accessibility (Home Inspection Insider) .
- o Clearance: Maintain the required front and side clearances even if the panel is behind a cabinet. Consider removable or hinged cabinet doors to allow full access.
- o Labeling and Organization: Clearly label all circuits and use proper cable management to avoid confusion and facilitate maintenance (MyUSA Wire) .
- o Compliance: Use UL/CE-certified components and follow local building codes and NEC standards to ensure safety and inspection approval (E-Abel) .

Practical Alternatives

If hiding the panel is necessary for aesthetic reasons, consider:

- o Installing the panel in a closet or utility room with a removable door or panel access.
- o Using a decorative cabinet with a hinged or sliding front that allows full access to the panel.
- o Ensuring the cabinet does not interfere with breaker operation, inspection, or emergency access.
