Why Too Many Circuits Can Be Dangerous

Each circuit is rated for a certain amperage, typically 15 or 20 amps for standard household circuits, and exceeding this limit stresses the system .

- o Appliance Damage: Electrical surges or inconsistent voltage from overloaded circuits can harm sensitive electronics and appliances .
- o Breaker Failure: Repeated overloads can weaken breakers over time, reducing their ability to protect the system .
- o Electrical Shock: Faulty or overloaded circuits increase the risk of electrocution .

Warning Signs of Overload

- o Flickering or dimming lights when multiple devices are used
- o Frequent tripping of breakers
- o Outlets or switches that feel warm to the touch
- o Faint burning smells near outlets or the breaker box

Safety Recommendations

- o Distribute Load Properly: Avoid plugging too many high-wattage appliances into a single circuit .
- o Install Dedicated Circuits: Appliances like microwaves, space heaters, or air conditioners should have their own circuits .
- o Upgrade the Panel: If your home's electrical demand exceeds the panel's capacity, consider upgrading to a higher-capacity panel .
- o Professional Inspection: Have a licensed electrician assess your system if you notice frequent trips, sparks, or other warning signs . Proper management of circuits and load distribution is essential to maintain safety and



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prevent costly damage. Overloading a panel or having too many circuits without proper planning is a serious risk that should be addressed promptly.
