

Use a gigabit switch to connect to fiber optic cable

To connect a fiber optic cable to a gigabit switch, use compatible SFP modules with duplex LC fiber cables, ensuring proper send/receive alignment.

Step 1: Identify Your Switch and Ports

Check if your gigabit switch has SFP ports (Small Form-factor Pluggable) or combo ports that support fiber connections. SFP ports typically support up to 1 Gbps, while SFP+ ports support 10 Gbps. Ensure the port is set to fiber mode if required by the switch configuration .

Step 2: Choose the Correct Fiber Type

- o Multimode fiber (MMF): Suitable for short distances (up to a few hundred meters), usually 850 nm wavelength .
- o Single-mode fiber (SMF): Suitable for long distances (kilometers), usually 1310 nm or 1550 nm wavelength . Select the fiber type that matches your network requirements and the SFP module.

Step 3: Select Compatible SFP Modules

Insert SFP transceiver modules into the switch ports. Ensure the module matches:

- o The fiber type (single-mode or multimode)
- o The network speed (1G for SFP, 10G for SFP+)
- o The connector type (most commonly LC duplex) SFP modules transmit separate send and receive signals, so duplex fiber is required .

Step 4: Prepare the Fiber Cable

Use duplex fiber optic cables with LC connectors. You can either:

- o Purchase pre-terminated fiber cables with LC connectors, or
- o Terminate bulk fiber in the field using LC connectors . Ensure the cable strands are correctly labeled for A/B alignment: the transmit (TX) of one switch connects to the receive (RX) of the other switch, and vice versa .

Step 5: Connect the Fiber

- o Insert the LC connectors into the SFP modules on each switch.
- o Verify that the TX/RX alignment is correct.

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- o Secure the cable to avoid bending or stress, as fiber is sensitive to sharp bends.

Step 6: Test the Link

After connecting, check the switch interface for link lights or status indicators. Ensure the port shows active and operational. If the link does not work, verify:

- o Fiber type and SFP compatibility
- o Correct duplex alignment
- o Port configuration on the switch

Optional: Using Media Converters

If your switch lacks SFP ports, a media converter can convert copper Ethernet to fiber, allowing connection to fiber networks . By following these steps, you can establish a reliable gigabit fiber connection between switches, ensuring high-speed and long-distance network performance .
