

Warning signs for electrical distribution boxes

Electrical distribution boxes should display clear, standardized warning signs to alert personnel to high voltage, shock, and fire hazards.

Key Warning Signs

High Voltage / Electrical Hazard Signs: These signs indicate the presence of live electrical components that can cause severe shock or electrocution. They are typically placed on distribution boards, switchboards, and fuse boxes to prevent accidental contact with energized parts . **Authorized Personnel Only:** This sign restricts access to trained personnel, reducing the risk of injury from tampering or improper handling of electrical equipment . **Disconnect Before Servicing / Lockout-Tagout Required:** These warnings instruct workers to de-energize circuits and follow lockout/tagout procedures before maintenance, ensuring safety during servicing . **Arc Flash / Shock Hazard Signs:** These caution signs alert workers to potential arc flash events or electrical shock risks, emphasizing the need for personal protective equipment (PPE) such as insulated gloves and face shields . **Multiple Power Sources / Equipment Powered by More Than One Source:** This sign warns that the distribution box may have multiple incoming power lines, which could pose additional hazards during maintenance .

Standards and Compliance

Electrical enclosure signs must comply with ANSI Z535 and ISO 7010 standards, as required by NFPA 79. These standards ensure that hazard symbols, colors, and text are consistent and easily recognizable, improving safety communication . Signs should be durable, weather-resistant, and visible at eye level, with bold black text on a yellow background for maximum impact .

Placement and Materials

- o **Placement:** On doors, walls, or directly on the distribution box, ensuring visibility from a safe distance.
- o **Materials:** Commonly made from rigid PVC, aluminum, or self-adhesive vinyl for indoor and outdoor use .
- o **Sizes:** Vary from compact (A5) for small panels to large (A3) for high-traffic areas .

Importance

Proper warning signs reduce the risk of electric shock, burns, and fire, prevent unauthorized access, and ensure compliance with workplace safety regulations. They serve as a visual reminder for workers to follow safety protocols and use appropriate PPE when interacting with electrical distribution systems . By implementing standardized, visible, and durable warning signs, facilities can significantly enhance electrical safety and
