

What are the acceptance criteria for distribution boxes

Key Principles

Acceptance criteria for distribution boxes are established to ensure that packaging can survive the physical and environmental stresses encountered during shipping. These criteria are based on ASTM D4169, the standard practice for performance testing of shipping containers and systems, which is widely recognized internationally and referenced in regulatory frameworks such as ISO 11607-1 for medical devices .

Defining Acceptance Criteria

- o Container Selection: The box or shipping unit must be representative of actual shipping conditions, including size, material, and construction .
- o Distribution Cycle (DC): Choose a distribution cycle that reflects the expected shipping scenario. ASTM D4169 defines 18 DCs, with DC-13 commonly used for small parcel shipments as a worst-case scenario .
- o Assurance Level (AL): Determine the severity of testing (drop heights, compression forces, vibration intensity). For critical items like sterile medical devices, AL-I is typically recommended .
- o Test Schedules: Apply the sequence of test schedules (A through J) corresponding to the selected DC. These simulate hazards such as handling impacts, vibration, vehicle stacking, and concentrated impacts .
- o Pre-conditioning: Condition packages to simulate environmental extremes (temperature, humidity) as per ASTM D4332 to account for material behavior under real-world conditions .
- o Evaluation: After testing, the package must remain unopened and maintain integrity. Acceptance criteria include:
 - o No structural failure of the box
 - o No compromise of seals or closures
 - o Protection of contents from damage
 - o Maintenance of sterile barriers if applicable

Documentation and Risk Assessment

- o Document the selected DC, AL, and test sequence.
- o Conduct a risk assessment to justify the choice of test parameters.
- o Record all observations, including visual inspections, seal strength, and any functional testing of contents .
