Quick Answer: The NEMA ST-20 standard defines maximum transformer noise levels by kVA: 40 dB for 0-9 kVA, 45 dB for 10-50 kVA, 50 dB for 51-150 kVA, 55 dB for 151-300 kVA, 60 dB for 301-500 kVA, 62 dB for 501-700 kVA, and 64 dB for 701-1000 kVA.
