

What does a 100Mbps fiber optic adapter look like

A 100Mbps fiber optic adapter typically appears as a small, rectangular SFP transceiver or a media converter with SC or LC fiber ports for connecting multimode or single-mode fiber cables.

100BASE-FX SFP Transceivers

A common 100Mbps fiber optic adapter is the 100BASE-FX SFP transceiver, which is a compact, hot-swappable module that plugs into a switch, router, or media converter port. It usually has a rectangular metal or plastic casing with one or two fiber ports on the front, often using SC or LC connectors. The module converts electrical Ethernet signals into optical signals at 1310nm wavelength for multimode fiber, supporting distances up to 2 km for standard multimode fiber links . The back of the SFP module interfaces with the device's SFP slot, providing a 100Mbps electrical connection internally.

Media Converters

Another form of a 100Mbps fiber optic adapter is a media converter, such as the TP-Link MC100CM. These devices are slightly larger boxes with fiber ports (SC-type) on one side and copper Ethernet ports (RJ45) on the other. They allow conversion between 100BASE-FX fiber and 100BASE-TX copper networks, supporting full-duplex 100Mbps transmission over multimode fiber up to 2 km . Media converters often include LED indicators for link status and power.

Fiber Optic Adapters (Couplers)

In addition to SFPs and media converters, fiber optic adapters (or couplers) are passive components used to join two fiber connectors. They are typically small rectangular or square blocks with alignment sleeves inside, made of ceramic or metal, to ensure precise core-to-core alignment. Common types include LC-LC, SC-SC, or LC-SC adapters, supporting simplex (one fiber) or duplex (two fibers for TX/RX) connections . These adapters are often mounted in patch panels or used for direct fiber connections between devices.
