Proper documentation reduces troubleshooting time and prevents mis-patching during network upgrades . 8. Test the Connection Optionally, use a Visual Fault Locator (VFL) or optical power meter to verify the connection and ensure signal integrity .

- o Never mix incompatible connectors (e.g., SC/APC with SC/UPC) as this can degrade performance .
 - o Handle the patch cord gently; fiber cables are more fragile than copper and can be damaged by excessive pulling or bending .
 - o Use patch panels for high-density installations to protect connectors and simplify future upgrades .
