Mechanical Splice Kits: For situations where fusion splicing is not feasible, mechanical splicing kits allow fibers to be joined without melting, using precision alignment and index-matching gel .

Pigtail Trunk and Splice Management Kits: These kits include splice trays, hook-and-loop straps, and cable management tools to organize pigtail legs, maintain bend radius, and prevent fiber pinching in high-density installations .

Alignment Kits for Laser-to-Fiber Coupling: For pigtails used in laser systems, alignment kits with centering lenses and torque-controlled screwdrivers help precisely align fibers to laser sources, especially for polarization-maintaining fibers .

Safety Equipment: Cut-resistant gloves, safety glasses, and proper handling tools are recommended to protect against sharp fiber ends and armored cable edges .
