FC (Ferrule Connector)

FC connectors have a threaded coupling, providing high stability in vibration-prone environments. They are commonly used in telecom long-haul single-mode links, industrial sites like oil rigs and mining operations, and precision measurement equipment such as OTDRs and spectrum analyzers. Their low signal loss and secure fit make them suitable for high-precision applications .

MPO/MTP Connectors

MPO/MTP connectors are multi-fiber connectors supporting 12, 24, or more fibers. They are primarily used in high-speed data centers, cloud computing infrastructures, and parallel optics applications (40G/100G/400G). These connectors reduce cabling complexity and are essential for large-scale, high-density network deployments .
