

Where to connect the fiber optic network to the router

Fiber optic cables connect to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which then connects to your router via the WAN/Ethernet port.

Understanding the Connection

Fiber optic internet does not plug directly into a standard home router because the optical signal must first be converted into an electrical signal. This conversion is handled by an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), typically provided and installed by your Internet Service Provider (ISP) near where the fiber enters your home . The ONT contains a dedicated fiber input port where the fiber cable is inserted, usually labeled "Fiber" or "GPON" .

Connecting the ONT to Your Router

Once the fiber cable is securely connected to the ONT:

- o Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN or Ethernet output port to your router's WAN or Internet port. This port is often labeled and may be colored differently to distinguish it from LAN ports .
- o Power on the ONT first, allowing it to establish a connection with your ISP's network.
- o Power on the router afterward, which will receive the converted signal from the ONT and distribute it to your devices via Wi-Fi or additional Ethernet ports .

Safety and Placement Tips

- o Handle the fiber cable carefully; the connectors are sensitive to dirt and damage. Always hold the cable by its plastic housing and remove protective caps before connecting .
- o Place both the ONT and router in a dry, well-ventilated area near electrical outlets, ideally with surge protection .
- o Ensure the ONT is close to the fiber entry point to minimize signal loss, and use high-quality Ethernet cables (Cat5e or higher) for optimal performance . By following this setup, your router will receive the internet signal from the ONT, allowing you to access high-speed fiber internet throughout your home.
