

Where to put industrial connectors in network cabinets

Key Placement Guidelines

1. **Accessibility and Maintenance** Industrial connectors should be installed in locations that are easily reachable for maintenance and troubleshooting. Industrial connectors should align with these pathways to prevent tangling and maintain airflow. Circular connectors or modular industrial connectors are preferred in high-density cabinets because they simplify connections and reduce clutter .
4. **Height and Rack Unit Considerations** Place connectors at standard rack heights (U positions) to match the devices they serve. For example, connectors supplying a switch should be mounted at the same U level as the switch or slightly above to allow short, neat cable runs . Avoid placing connectors too low or too high, which can complicate cable routing and maintenance.
5. **Environmental and Safety Considerations** Ensure connectors do not obstruct airflow or cooling paths. Avoid placing them near ventilation openings or hot spots. Use IP-rated connectors if the cabinet is exposed to dust or moisture, and secure them to prevent accidental disconnection .
6. **Documentation and Labeling** Label each connector clearly, indicating its function, source, and destination. This is critical for maintenance, troubleshooting, and compliance with standards such as ISO/IEC 27001 or DIN EN 50600 . Consistent labeling also helps differentiate between internal and external network connections.
